Man Charged With Killing Wife In UK Ran Shop In India Before Disappearing

Harshita Brella was found strangled and hidden in the boot of a car in Ilford, East London, on November 14, 2024.

(By Our Staff Reporter): UK police have travelled to India as part of their ongoing search for Pankaj Lamba, the man accused of killing his wife, Harshita Brella, in the UK last year. He was seen running a shop in Delhi earlier this year, as per reports. Brella, 24, was found strangled and hidden in the boot of a car in Ilford, East London, on November 14, 2024. Investigators believe she was murdered days earlier, on 10 November, in Corby, Northamptonshire. Lamba fled to India soon after the crime and remains missing. The couple, both from Delhi, moved to the UK earlier that year. In March earlier this year, Northamptonshire Police charged





"Neither the UK government nor the Indian government are doing anything.

Her sister Sonia Dabas says the family feels ignored by both governments. "We are very disappointed with the UK police. Maybe because we are not citizens of the UK, that's why they are not serious about this case." Weeks before her murder, Harshita Brella reported domestic abuse by her husband. Police arrested Lamba but released him on bail with restrictions that expired a month before her death. "That's when Pankaj figured out that the UK police are not really serious about this case, and he felt he could get away with murder," Dabas said. The Independent Office for Police Conduct (IOPC) investigating abuse complaint. The IOPC says its report has been completed and shared with the force, which has until mid-November to respond.

The Politics of Anarchy Socialists regard disorder as a means to an end: government control

Anarchists detonated a bomb in 1920 at J.P. Morgan & Co.'s headquarters at 23 Wall St., killing 38 and wounding more than 100. Scars from that bombing are still visible today. So are anarchists. As the little girl said in "Poltergeist II," "They're back."

Shein Sex-Doll Standoff Is A European Humiliation

Nothing epitomizes regulatory failure like the huge poster of Shein Ltd. Chairman Donald Tang at the BHV department store in Paris, where the Chinese e-commerce platform's first physical outlet opened this week. For years now, consumer watchdogs in Europe have been warning about cheap and unsafe knock-offs arriving by the planeload from Shein and PDD Holdings Inc.'s Temu. Governments have done very little in response, even as a test this week found that 70% of orders from the two platforms including chargers, toys and jewelry were defective

Now that French authorities have moved to suspend Shein's website and asked the European Commission to open a probe following reports that weapons and childlike sex dolls were being sold on its platform, one could well ask: "What took you so long?" A plethora of third-party sellers and Shein's own controversial network of 7,000 factories (primarily in China) have raised red flags over weak controls and opacity. With the broader popularity of shop-til-you-drop e-commerce platforms delivering the equivalent of 145 parcels per second into the European Union last year, it was only a matter of time before drugs, weapons or something even darker turned up.

Shein says it's cooperating "100%" and that it has banned all sex dolls from its websites. But this is a systemic

Shein's business model and Europe's apparent inability to enforce its own laws. Packages are flying under authorities' noses largely because those worth less than €150 (\$173) are exempt from customs duties, a threshold that Shein and Temu's low prices easily avoid; this is similar to the "de minimis" treatment of low-value imports in the US that the Trump administration has suspended. While the EU has proposed reforms along the same lines. it will take years to come into force.





The fact that a former French government minister advised Shein until recently shows the scale of its lobbying power in a country where ready-to-wear has lost 50,000 jobs over the past decade. Geopolitics is also likely at work, with France hesitant to give Beijing more reasons to

punish Louis Vuitton handbags and Remy Cointreau cognac.

With Paris now recognizing that the situation has become untenable, the path to better enforcement is clear. Customs reform is essential. So is regulation at platform level and knowing who to call when the rules are being broken. Again, these rules already exist. Back in June, European consumer group BEUC accused Shein of being in breach of the Unfair Commercial Practices Directive, pointing to alleged fake discounts and pressure-selling tactics like "low stock" messages.

The EU shouldn't expect France to handle these issues alone in a borderless market of 27 countries. As for the UK, which is neither inside the EU nor in the running for a Shein IPO, it has no excuse. None of this has to be fatal for the likes of Shein, which claims its cheap prices come from its efficient supply chain and which has been relaxed about governments cracking down on loopholes. It's eyeing a bumper \$2 billion in net income in 2025 and it is still upending the retail landscape, pressuring merchants from Asos Plc to Zara parent Inditex SA. But even if the e-commerce genie is out of the bottle, the need for a level playing field is essential - and if platforms can't play by the rules, then a ban has to be on the table. The Islamists are trying for a new state structure, resembling the era of Pakistan rule. The current regime isn't neutral and does not intend to hold free and fair elections.

The student-led quota reform movement transformed into a broader anti-discrimination movement of students and the masses. Regardless of political affiliation, nearly 99% of the country's population participated in this struggle, either directly or indirectly. From the people's side, the movement remained non-violent and limited to resisting armed aggression.

However, after the movement's success, some student coordinators and participants began to speak openly. Their statements revealed that the student movement was, in fact, neither unarmed nor non-violent. What Mamdani Can Teach The Congress - And Rahul Gandhi

"The working people of New York have been told by the wealthy and the well-connected that power does not belong in their hands... And yet, over the last 12 months, you have dared to reach for something greater. Tonight, against all odds, we have grasped it. The future is in our hands. My friends, we have toppled a political dynasty."

These words, by now, have been heard by millions across the globe. They have leapt out of newspapers, televisions, and, perhaps most potently, Instagram. All this has happened because Zohran Mamdani, a 34year-old migrant Muslim, a self-declared democratic socialist of mixed parentage - a man who might easily have been consigned to the margins of contemporary political economy has become the new mayor of New York City.

Mamdani's success has signalled even when out of office. a system reset: a toppling of a political dynasty that sought legitimacy from the common people even as it worked to de-power them. Who was Mamdani fighting? On the road to New York's City Hall, he met with intense opposition from the business and financial community. Mamdani's progressive platform - freezing rent prices, taxing the city's wealthiest one per cent, and demanding corporate accountability - alarmed traditional Democratic donors and real estate magnates. Over 20 billionaires spent millions to back his opponents, including former Governor Andrew Cuomo. Figures like Michael Bloomberg, Bill Ackman, and Ronald Lauder funded an unprecedented campaign against him, terrified that his economic agenda would drive away corporations and destabilise the real estate mar-

And yet, he won.

A 2019 meeting of right-wing donors - from Peter Thiel to J.D. Vance and Tucker Carlson - had sought to make the MAGA movement an enduring political machine. Mamdani confronted a similar corporate-political nexus in New York and beat it. He re-centred democracy around people rather than profit. The lesson from Mamdani is simple: dismantling this usurpation of people's power must be done by returning to the people.

If 104,000 volunteers could make 4.4 million calls for Mamdani, what can the Congress under Rahul Gandhi conjure in India? But, like Mamdani's Democrats, Rahul Gandhi has inherited a Congress that resists change comfortable in its proximity to power,



Perpetual Inaction

For decades, Congress's reflex after every electoral defeat has been to form a committee. The Committee Raj has become its comfort zone - a bureaucratic ritual that replaces action with analysis. In May 2022, Sonia terim president, established a highprofile Empowered Action Group (EAG) to address Congress's political challenges ahead of the 2024 elections. However, there is no record of the EAG holding deliberations between 2022 and 2024. Nor is there any the 18th Lok Sabha polls.

After the losses in Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh in 2023, internal reports were filed, but not discussed. Inside The 'Amendment' That May Make Asim Munir Pak's Supreme Authority

The 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill, tabled by Pakistan's federal government and passed by the Senate on November 10, is far from a routine procedural adjustment. It represents structural reconfiguration of the Pakistani state. The provisions, now awaiting final approval from the National Assembly, will effectively formalise Pakistan's foundational transition from a de facto hybrid military system to a constitutional framework in terations, the Pakistani military's in-ture. which the military establishment fluence in the country's politics, holds a legally codified and dominant position.

Among its key amendments pertaining to the judicial and security design, the bill critically proposes revisions to Article 243 of the Pakistani Constitution. Amendments to this article would establish the new position of Chief of Defence Forces while abolishing the existing office of Staff Committee (CJCSC). This article defines the relationship behead of states in matters relating to the command and control of the defence forces. An alteration to this clause will trigger implications for civilian government in the country and a power shift to Pakistan's constitutional order.

Key amendments proposed under Article 243 would entail:

Abolishing the Office of CJCSC, effective from November 27

Establishing a new post of Chief of Defence Forces (CDF), a position serving Chief of Army Staff (COAS)

The amendments institute a Commander of National Strategic Command, who will be an army official appointed by the Prime Minister on the recommendation of the CDF

The bill extends life-long constitutional protection to 5-star rank officers, including Field Marshal. This entails privileges, lifetime tenure, and legal immunity granted under Article 248 and protection from removal under Article 47 of Pakistan's Constitution




What to know about Trump's plan to give Americans a \$2,000 tariff dividend

(News Agency) WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump boasts that his tariffs protect American industries, lure factories to the United States, raise money for the federal government and give him diplomatic leverage. Now, he's claiming they can finance a windfall for American families, too: He's promising a generous tariff dividend. •The president proposed the idea on his Truth Social media platform Sunday, five days after his Republican Party lost elections in Virginia, New Jersey and elsewhere largely because of voter discontent with his economic stewardship - specifically, the high cost of living. he tariffs are bringing in so much money, the president posted, that "a dividend of at least \$2000 a person (not including high income people!) will be paid to everyone."

udget experts scoffed at the idea. which conjured memories of the Trump administration's short-lived plan for DOGE dividend checks financed by billionaire Elon Musk's federal budget cuts. "The numbers just don't check out," said Erica York, vice president of federal tax policy at the nonpartisan Tax Foundation. · Details are scarce, including what the income limits would be and whether payments would go to children. Even Trump's treasury secretary, Scott Bessent, sounded a bit blindsided by the audacious dividend plan. Appearing Sunday on ABC's "This Week," Bessent said he hadn't discussed the dividend with

the president and suggested that it might not mean that Americans would get a check from the government. Instead, Bessent said, the rebate might take the form of tax cuts. •The tariffs are certainly raising money — \$195 billion in the budget year that ended Sept. 30, up 153% from \$77 billion in fiscal 2024. But they still account for less than 4% of federal revenue and have done little to dent the federal budget deficit — a staggering \$1.8 trillion in fiscal 2025. John Ricco, an analyst with the Budget Lab at Yale University, reckons that Trump's tariffs will bring in \$200 billion to \$300 billion a year in revenue. But a \$2,000 dividend — if it went to all Americans, including children — would cost \$600 billion. "It's clear that the revenue coming in would not be adequate," he said. Ricco also noted that Trump couldn't just pay the dividends on his own. They would require legislation from Congress.

Foreover, the centerpiece of Trump's protectionist trade policies — double-digit taxes on imports from almost every country in the world — may not survive a legal challenge that has reached the U.S. Supreme Court. In a hearing last week, the justices sounded skeptical about the Trump administration's assertion of sweeping power to declare national emergencies to justify the tariffs. Trump has bypassed Congress, which has authority under the Constitution to levy taxes, including tariffs.

Apple Drops Gay Dating Apps 'Blued', Finka' From China On Government Order

(News Agency) Apple said it has pulled two of China's biggest gay dating apps, Blued and Finka, under pressure from Chinese authorities, in the latest sign of a tightening grip on the LGBTQ community. An Apple spokesperson said in a statement that the company removed the two dating apps from China "based on an order from the Cyberspace Administration of China", without further elaborating. "We follow the laws in the countries where we operate," the spokesperson told The Associated Press. A check by The Associated Press on Tuesday found that the two apps are not available on Apple's app store in China, although an "express" version of Blued could still be found. It was unclear what the difference is between the full and express versions or if an Android version might be available. Blued was dismissed regime was composed of various available "only in China," Apple said. Finka's

developer "elected to remove the app" outside of China earlier this year, the company added. Another popular gay dating app, Grindr, was pulled from Apple's app store in China in 2022. China's LGBTQ community and advocacy groups are under intensifying pressure from authorities, even though the country decriminalized homosexuality in 1997. Some LGBTQ groups have been forced to cease operations in recent years in China and activism has been constrained. Blued and Finka have the same parent company, BlueCity, a China-founded company that focuses on the LGBTQ community in China and abroad. BlueCity was delisted from the Nasdag in 2022. when it was taken private. Last year, Apple also reportedly removed apps including WhatsApp and Threads from its app store in China under an order by the Cyberspace Administration of China.

China's 'Cryptoqueen' Jailed In **UK Over \$6.6 Billion Bitcoin Scam**

(News Agency) A Chinese woman who was found with 5 billion pounds (\$6.6 billion) in Bitcoin after defrauding more than 128,000 people in China in a Ponzi scheme was sentenced by a UK court on Tuesday to over 11 years in prison. Police said the investigation into Zhimin Qian, 47, led to officers recovering devices holding 61,000 Bitcoin in the largest cryptocurrency seizure in the UK. Qian, dubbed "cryptoqueen" by British media, was arrested in April 2024 after spending years evading the authorities and living an "extravagant" lifestyle in Europe, staying in luxury hotels across the continent and buying fine jewelry and watches, prosecutors said. •Police said she ran a pyramid scheme that lured more than 128,000 people to invest in her business between 2014 and 2017. including many who invested their life savings and pensions. Authorities said she stored the illegally obtained funds in Bitcoin assets. When she attracted the attention of Chinese authorities. Qian fled to the UK under a fake identity. Once in London, police said she rented a "lavish" house for over 17,000 pounds (\$23,000) per month. •Investigators found notes Qian had written documenting her aspirations — including her "intention to become the monarch of Liberland, a self-proclaimed country consisting of a strip of land between Croatia and Serbia." The businesswoman, who had pleaded guilty to money laundering offenses and transferring and possessing criminal property, was sentenced Tuesday to 11 years and eight months at Southwark Crown Court. She was sentenced alongside her accomplice Seng Hok Ling, 47, a Malaysian national who was accused of helping Qian transfer and launder the cryptocurrency. Ling was jailed at the same court for four years and 11 months after he pleaded guilty to one count of transferring criminal property.

Families Across Northern India Mourn Victims of Red Fort Blast

(By Our Staff Reporter): The powerful explosion near Delhi's Red Fort not only shattered the capital's calm but also brought devastation to families hundreds of kilometres away, who are now struggling to cope with the sudden loss of their loved ones. From the guiet villages of Shravasti and Deoria to the bustling towns of Meerut, Amroha, and Shamli, the victims of the deadly car blast were ordinary people — taxi and e-rickshaw drivers, cosmetic shop owners, and bus conductors — all striving to support their families and build better lives. Among them was 32year-old Dinesh Mishra of Ganeshpur village in Shravasti district, who worked at a printing press in Delhi's Chawri Bazar to provide for his wife and three children. His father, Bhure Mishra, recalled Dinesh's recent visit home for Diwali. "He was a hardworking man. He wanted to give his children a good education. We still can't believe he is gone," Bhure said, his voice breaking as neighbours gathered to console the family. District Magistrate Ashwini Pandey confirmed that Dinesh's body was being brought back to Shravasti and would arrive by Tuesday evening. "We have spoken to the family and assured them of all possible assistance," he told PTI. In Meerut, grief was compounded by discord as the family of 32-year-old Mohsin — an e-rickshaw driver who had moved to Delhi two years ago — disagreed over



wanted him laid to rest in Delhi, where they had made a home and their children studied, his parents insisted on burving him in Meerut. Neighbours tried to mediate as emotions ran high. "The blast took Mohsin away, but now even the family is divided," said a neighbour. After hours of tension and police involvement, Sultana ultimately took the body for burial. Eighteen-yearold Nauman Ansari from Shamli was in Delhi to buy cosmetics for his shop when the explosion cut his life short. "Nauman was killed on the spot while his cousin Aman sustained injuries and is undergoing treatment at Lok Navak

"Ashok was the sole breadwinner for the family," panchayat member Pintu Bhati said. Also among the deceased was 58-year-old Lokesh

Kumar Agarwal, a fertiliser dealer from Hasanpur, who had gone to Delhi to visit a relative at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital. "Lokesh was a kind-hearted man who helped everyone in need," said his neighbour Yashpal Singh. In Deoria, 22year-old Shiva Jaiswal, who ran a small garment shop in Bhaluani, was among those injured. He had gone to Delhi to buy new stock for the festival season. His sister, Purnima Jaiswal, recounted that he had called earlier that day. "Then we heard about the blast on TV and his phone went unreachable. Later, we found out he was admitted to LNJP Hospital," she said. Shiva's mother, Mava Jaiswal, a local BJP Mahila Morcha worker, said she was grateful her son had survived. "He was lucky this time," she said softly. Another victim, 22-year-old Pankaj Sahni from Bihar, drove a taxi in Delhi to support his family. His uncle, Ramdev Sahni, received the tragic news from Kotwali Police Station. "He drove a taxi for three years. We were told the back of his head was blown off. The car, a WagonR, was completely damaged," Sahni said while waiting outside the mortuary. According to Delhi Police, 12 people were killed and over 20 injured in the November 10 blast, which is being investigated by the National Investigation Agency as a possible terror attack. Delhi and neighbouring states, including Uttar Pradesh, remain on high alert.





The system protects those who commit caste violence while blaming victims for asserting dignity

Within the span of days, two incidents have laid bare the entrenched caste realities of contemporary India and the impunity that the Hindu-tva regime has institutionalised. On October 6, 2025 a 71-year-old lawyer hurled a shoe at Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai, a Dalit, inside the Supreme Court, defiantly shouting "Sanatan ka apmaan nahi sahega Hindustan" (India will not tolerate insult to Sanatan Dharma). He was released without charges, his shoe returned, facing no consequences for attacking the country's highest judicial authority. The very next day, October 7, Additional Director General of Police Y. Puran Kumar, also a Dalit, died by suicide at his Chandigarh residence, leaving an eight-page note describing years of caste humiliation and harassment by senior officers. Despite huge public outrage, nothing has been done to the perpetrators.

These two events, occurring within 24 hours, are not aberrations but revelations of a deeper malaise—the normalisation of caste violence and Brahminical supremacy under a majoritarian Hindutva order that has erased accountability for crimes committed in the name of Sanatan Dharma or Hindu honour. One incident reflects physical assault on a Dalit constitutional authority without reprisal; the other, psychological persecution that drove a senior officer to death. Together, they expose an ecosystem where Dalits-irrespective of office, achievement, or rank-remain vulnerable to humiliation and violence sanctioned by ideological impunity.

These are not isolated tragedies but logical outcomes of the Hindutva project that the ruling regime has consolidated over the past decade—an order that punishes dianity itself.

The Shoe That Revealed Everything

The attack on Chief Justice B.R. Gavai was unprecedented in audacity and deeply revealing in consequence. In a packed Supreme Court room, a lawyer hurled his shoe at the bench headed by CJI Gavai, defiantly shouting a slogan sourced from the Hindutya playbook. He later claimed he was enraged by the CJI's quip—"ask the deity itself to do something"—while dismissing a frivolous plea to restore a Vishnu idol at Khajuraho. Such verbal retorts by judges. right or wrong, are not uncommon. However, the Hindutva networks seized on the remark as an "insult to Sanatan Dharma", manufacturing the outrage that Dharma, a Dalit exercising authority fuelled the assault.

What followed laid bare the regime's moral collapse. The assailant was released within hours. He boasted to the press. "I have no regrets... I was hurt." The Prime Minister's bland condemnation avoided any commitment to legal action. The Bar remained silent; the media soon moved on. By contrast, when a Mumbai lawyer threw a shoe at CJI A.S. Anand in 1999, aggrieved by the verdict in his property matter, he was convicted of contempt and sentenced to four months imprisonment and a fine.

Kishore's act was graver because it was ideological. His slogan invoked Sanatan Dharma—a euphemism for Brahminism that sanctifies caste hierarchyasserting that religious sentiment trumps constitutional authority. It claimed the right to assault a Dalit Chief Justice in defence of "Hindu honour," confident that society would understand, perhaps even celebrate, the act. This confidence of impunity is no accident. It is the product of a decade-long Hindutva campaign that

weaponises religion to defend caste and has normalised upper-caste violence under the banner of faith. When cow vigilantes lynch Muslims, interfaith couples are attacked, or homes are bulldozed without due process, the same message resounds: violence in the name of Sanatan Dharma enjoys state protection. The online abuse of CJI Gavai was overtly casteist, mocking his intelligence and legitimacy. The hate spewed against him as a Dalit on social media is criminal, but the entire state machinery has been silent. The outrage over "insult to Sanatan" was merely a polite mask for fury at a Dalit occupying the highest judicial office and dismissing an upper-caste petitioner. In the Brahminical logic encoded in Sanatan represents an inversion of the natural order that must be violently corrected. Kishore's attack-and the regime's indulgence—thus revealed everything about Hindutva's compact with caste: that in the new India, religious offence is punishable, but caste violence is not.

The Suicide Note That Indicts a System

On October 7, 2025, Additional Director General of Police Y. Puran Kumar, a 2001-batch Dalit IPS officer from Andhra Pradesh serving in Haryana, shot himself at his Chandigarh residence. In his suicide note, he named several IPS and IAS officers, accusing them of sustained mental harassment, humiliation, and caste-based discrimination.

Kumar detailed how he was sidelined despite seniority, denied postings he deserved, and targeted through fabricated charges. His note spoke of a systematic campaign of humiliation, including attempts to implicate him in a fake bribery case. His wife. Amneet Kumar, an IAS officer, filed a complaint

holding the named officials responsible for his death and demanding their suspension and arrest. What has emerged from Kumar's note reveals the pervasive caste bias that Dalit officers continue to face in "meritocratic" institutions. Kumar wrote of years of "mental harassment and humiliation", of being denied recognition and opportunities his upper-caste peers enjoyed. His decision to end his life after naming his tormentors was both an act of despair and an indictment—a demand that the system confront its casteist rot. Kumar's death demolishes the myth that rank or merit protects Dalits from caste oppression. Here was an officer one step below the state's top cop, yet, even his uniform and authority could not shield him from institutionalised caste prejudice. If an ADGP could be hounded to suicide. what hope remains for Dalit constables or sub-inspectors, not to speak of ordinary Dalits?

The tragedy underscores that caste hierarchy persists beneath the veneer of equality. Despite constitutional safeguards and diversity mandates, India's police forces remain dominated by upper castes, reproducing social hierarchies within the bureaucracy. Dalit officers are routinely marginalised, denied postings, discredited for success, and reminded that—whatever their rank—their caste defines their place. Kumar's final note stands as a searing testament: in caste India, even power wears the badge of humiliation.

The Hindutva Regime's Enabling of **Caste Impunity**

The current regime has strategically elevated a few Dalits such as Presidents Kovind and Murmu and select ministers to project inclusiveness.

aspirational symbols, deflects charges of casteism, and lets the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) claim empowerment while tightening caste hierarchies.

The experiences of CJI Gavai and ADGP Kumar expose the emptiness of this gesture. Symbolic elevation without structural reform offers no protection. When Dalits in high office act independently—as CJI Gavai did when dismissing the Khajuraho petition—they face violence that goes unpunished. When they rise by merit—as Kumar did—they face relentless humiliation the system refuses to address. Visibility masks vulnerability; caste remains the invisible law of power. No wonder, atrocities against Dalits in NCRB reports show a sudden spurt: the average yearly number of cognizable offences against Dalits shooting up from 32,494 to 45,622 during the nine years preceding and succeeding the BJP's takeover of power at the Centre

ideological, rooted in the Rashtriya resistance. Swayamsevak Sangh's (RSS's) worldview. From Golwalkar onward, the RSS has glorified varna dharma as a divinely ordained social order. Caste hierarchy, rebranded as cultural harmony, is central to its conception of Hindu at CJI Gavai in the Supreme Court, from civilisation. Once this ideology captured the historical humiliation of Dalit officials

governance by other means—seen in the dilution of SC/ST protections, rise in atrocities, and appointment of uppercaste loyalists across institutions.

The shoe thrown at CJI Gavai and Kumar's suicide expose the same reality: the regime showcases Dalits for legitimacy while preserving Brahminical dominance through systemic impunity.

Both incidents expose a clear pattern: impunity for perpetrators, vulnerability for Dalits-no matter their rank. Kishore assaults the Chief Justice and walks free; officers named in ADGP Kumar's suicide note continue in service despite his wife's not signal emancipation; they mask complaint. FIRs and inquiries follow, but accountability never arrives.

This impunity is structural, not accidental. With investigative agencies subservient to the regime, judges intimidated, media complicit, and civil society silenced, the system protects those who commit caste violence while blaming victims for asserting dignity. It is an order designed This impunity is not incidental but to shield perpetrators and punish

chilling.

Neither constitutional office nor professional merit offers real protection. Upper castes still resist Dalit authority, respond to assertion with violence, and rely on a state apparatus that ensures impunity. Formal equality exists only on paper; Brahminical hierarchy has been reinstalled beneath the veneer of democracy under the current regime.

The lesson for Dalits is stark: individual success within a casteist order cannot secure collective liberation. A few elevated figures—CJI Gavai or ADGP Kumar—do continuing subjugation. Kumar's suicide exposes how token inclusion becomes another form of violence when institutions remain Brahminical at the core.

A lawyer assaults the Chief Justice and walks free; officers accused of harassing a Dalit ADGP remain in office. This is not democracy but rule by impunity. The regime has crippled institutional independence-investigative agencies serve power, courts face intimidation, and media functions as propaganda. When even the highest offices offer no protection, ordinary Dalits are left entirely exposed.

Accountability must begin with prosecuting Kishore and the officers named in Kumar's note. Justice demands (Views expressed are personal)

This token representation offers state power, caste violence became to Kumar's final note, the continuity is independent institutions and sustained political struggle, not momentary outrage. Dalits must reject the BJP's tokenism and pursue Ambedkar's unfinished taskthe annihilation of caste, not its reform. The assaults on Gavai and Kumar show that no Dalit is safe while impunity reigns; only solidarity across caste, religion, and region can challenge this authoritarian caste order.

Two Incidents, One System

The shoe hurled at CJI Gavai and Kumar's suicide spring from the same source: a regime that sanctifies caste hierarchy under the banner of Hindu nationalism. Kishore's audacity, Kumar's despair, and the state's silence expose a society where Brahminical ideology thrives behind democratic facades.

These are not isolated tragedies but symptoms of a designed order—one that rewards perpetrators and punishes assertion. Resistance must mean more than mourning; it must mean naming the system, organising against it, and refusing the normalisation of caste violence. Until caste hierarchy is dismantled, until Sanatan Dharma's caste core is unmasked, until impunity is replaced with justice, the shoe will be thrown again, and another suicide note will appear. The task before us is to ensure it need not.





A refugee's deportation rattles a deeply conservative town: 'What Trump has done is not Christlike'

Binod Shah, a refugee from Bhutan, went to church, got married and started an auto shop in Twin Falls, Idaho. But an arrest record got him caught in the ICE dragnet

Stephanie Shah kept her eyes on the winding road as rain streaked across the windshield. Her husband, Binod Shah, sat in silence beside her, staring out the window. It was late evening in Washington state on 23 March, and they had been driving all day, trading shifts, barely speaking, while their nine-monthold son dozed beneath a blanket in the backseat. The sky hung low and gray, and evergreens, soaked and still, stood witness along the road. Inside the car, a Nepali-Christian folk song played quietly on repeat. At some point, Binod reached over and rested his hand on Stephanie's leg. It wasn't reassurance. It felt more like a final touch.

When the baby started to cry, Stephanie pulled over and together they changed his diaper, working without words. Then Binod leaned down, kissed his son's forehead, and began to cry.

As they got back on the road, Stephanie's mind raced with thoughts she did not dare say out loud: "What if I just turned around? What if I drove him to Mexico and we disappeared?"

She tried to picture this alternative life on the run. But she had grown up in a strict, conservative Christian household. At 18, Stephanie joined a Christian Obeying the law wasn't just a rule - it was a commandment of the Lord.

"That's what I'd always been told: that if you follow the rules, things work out," she said.

After hours of driving, and a futile stop at the Canadian border, the road narrowed. Ahead, floodlights lit up a chainlink fence, and a gray concrete building came into view - the quiet machinery of a government at work. Google Maps' robotic voice broke the silence, confirming they had arrived at the Northwest ICE processing center in Shah. Tacoma, just outside Seattle, Binod's upbringing was nothing like Washington.

Stephanie parked the car and kissed Binod goodbye. His deportation to his country of birth, Bhutan, triggered by a criminal conviction, complicated by his refugee status and enabled by an aggressive anti-immigration machine, would shatter their life and shake the political convictions of Christian conservatives in Twin Falls, Idaho.

Making a new life in Idaho

Stephanie, 35, grew up in Blackfoot, Idaho, where her father was a minister and her mother homeschooled the children. Most of her neighbors were Mormons, while her family belonged to a small evangelical congregation. "You don't think of someone like me as a religious minority, but I was," she told



me in one of multiple phone interviews. States began a resettlement program outside the refugee center. was only able to speak to me through Facebook Messenger.

ministry that took her to Uganda and later Indonesia, where she taught English for two years among Indigenous communities and at an orphanage. When she returned to Idaho, she enrolled at Aletheia Christian college, about 10 miles north of Twin Falls. There, the college's founders, Pastor Randall Davis and his wife, Dr Diane Davis, who is also a professor at the college, introduced her to the growing Bhutanese refugee community in Twin Falls, including a young man named Binod

hers. Binod, now 40, was only four when Bhutan expelled more than 100,000 Nepali-speaking Lhotshampa in the early 1990s under its "one nation, one people" campaign. The policy stripped many ethnic minorities of their citizenship, banned the Nepali language in schools, and criminalized dissent, with brutal military crackdowns against those who spoke out. Human Rights Watch and other international groups later described the expulsions as a form of ethnic cleansing.

Like most Bhutanese refugees, Binod's family spent years in camps in eastern Nepal, living in bamboo huts behind barbed wire, with rationed food and water and no electricity. After years of failed repatriation talks, in 2007 the United

Binod, already in hiding in south Asia, and by 2016 had accepted more than 86,000 Bhutanese refugees. While most ended up in Ohio and Pennsylvania, some went to Twin Falls.

> Twin Falls sits in Idaho's southern Magic valley, a city of more than 50,000 that is about 75% white. Conservative and deeply Christian, the town has consistently voted Republican, backing Donald Trump in both 2016 and 2024. Yet since the 1980s, it has been one of only two cities in Idaho, along with Boise, to accept resettled refugees: first southeast Asians, then eastern Europeans from the former Soviet bloc, Bosnians in the 1990s, and later families from Africa and the Middle East. In 2008. Bhutanese families like Binod's joined this stream of newcomers, drawn by Twin Falls's affordable housing, agricultural iobs and schools that offered an ESL program to refugee students; about 150 Bhutanese refugees live there now.

> For years, the system worked: adults found steady jobs on dairy farms, and children settled into local classrooms. But in 2016, as Trump's first presidential campaign stoked fears about immigrants and Muslims, Breitbart and other rightwing news outlets exaggerated reports that refugee boys had raped a young girl in Twin Falls, igniting protests, militia activity and a wave of anti-refugee sentiment across the city. The outrage quieted during the Biden years, but resentment never fully disappeared. In the lead-up to the 2024 election, a small group of Trump supporters demonstrated

Binod took on multiple jobs after his arrival in Twin Falls, and was on the path to permanent residency: under US law. refugees can apply for a green card after one year in the country and citizenship after five. "Binod was always working," Randall remembered. "Washing dishes at a Chinese restaurant one day, working in a gun shop the next. He was sharp and relentless."

When Stephanie pursued a master's degree in intercultural communication, focusing her thesis on Bhutanese Hindu communities in Twin Falls, Binod became her translator. His ease with people drew her in, and their conversations often stretched long after the work ended. They spoke about their childhoods: Stephanie grew up in a tightknit community, yet often felt out of place; Binod had come of age in a refugee camp, stateless and uncertain of his future. Faith also tied them together. Stephanie had been raised Christian, while Binod came to it later, eventually joining a church in town where Randall and Diane held leadership roles and many refugee families attended

Sometimes, the conversations turned to politics. Stephanie, a conservative, says her moral compass was set by belief in scripture, strong borders and opposition to abortion. "Binod liked playing devil's advocate when we talked about politics," she recalled. "He did agree with some of Trump's policies, especially on the



Then one snowy day in January 2020, arrested at anytime - regardless of Binod surprised her. "We should make this official," he said. It wasn't a question about dating. It was a proposal.

Stephanie had prayed since she was 14 for a husband who was hardworking, charismatic, unafraid, relentless, devoted, "Binod had all of them," she said

Her father, who had met Binod in ministry trips to Twin Falls, gave his blessing quickly. He told his daughter: "I'm way more OK with this than I thought I would

Caught in Trump's dragnet

However. Stephanie did not go into the engagement blind, and Binod's past was no secret. In May 2017, Binod was arrested in Twin Falls after an altercation with his first wife, who told police he had threatened her with a knife, according to reporting from East Idaho News and available court documents. Binod denied holding a weapon but pleaded guilty to felony aggravated assault the following year, by which time the couple had filed for divorce. At sentencing, the judge called the incident "disturbing" and ordered five years of probation along with 90 days in jail.

"They said, if you go to trial, you'll get 10 years, but if you take the plea bargain, you'll get 90 days," said Stephanie. In the US, an estimated 98% of criminal convictions come through guilty pleas, according to the American Bar Association, a system critics say disproportionately harms immigrants, the poor and those with limited access to legal counsel.

Even though Binod had been here for a decade, his English was still rough. He didn't fully understand what pleading guilty meant," Stephanie said.

Randall put it in starker terms: "The attorney told him to take a plea deal without explaining that he was walking straight into his life sentence."

Binod's public defender and the district attorney who tried his case did not respond to requests for comment.

Binod's criminal conviction triggered deportation proceedings, and he lost his green card. In 2019, an immigration judge ordered him removed from the US. "If you're undocumented, you can be sent to North Idaho correctional

whether you have a criminal record or even if you've performed heroic service," said Miriam Hayward, a retired immigration judge from San Francisco. "Refugees are different. They came here legally, and the US government determined they had a well-founded fear of persecution in their home country. They're on a pathway to citizenship. But that doesn't mean they can't be deported."

Major and minor convictions alike, such as shoplifting or driving under the influence, are grounds for deportation, including for green card holders and refugees, says Dr Julia Gelatt, associate director of the US Immigration Policy Program at the Migration Policy Institute. Gelatt also stressed that under US law, "people shouldn't be sent to a country where they face a credible fear of persecution or torture," as would be the case for many refugees.

Binod was detained by ICE for nearly nine months, but Bhutan, which had long denied repatriation requests, refused to accept him. ICE eventually released him under supervision. In October 2020, Stephanie and Binod married.

"I looked up his record. I prayed. I talked to my parents. I spoke with mentors and people I trust," Stephanie said. "I knew the risk, but I also knew that we were called to be together."

Before meeting Stephanie, Binod had been learning to fix cars in his sister's garage. Upon release, he began volunteering his mechanical skills around town, often helping those who could not afford repairs. Diane Davis remembered one winter night when a tourist got stranded in the snow while driving to Las Vegas, and a police officer towed the car to Binod's garage. "Binod not only fixed it." Diane said. "he staved up all night working on it and never charged a cent."

In January 2021, Stephanie and Binod registered Shah Automotive in Idaho. "We were a good team," Stephanie said. "Binod was incredibly skilled, and I enjoyed handling the administrative side." But trouble returned. In 2022, Binod was arrested for felony DUI and

institution in Cottonwood. He was released in April 2023, and though his parole officer recommended early discharge for good behavior - "Binod had maintained sobriety and demonstrated a positive lifestyle," wrote the officer his probation was extended to 2027. Back in Twin Falls, Binod and Stephanie bought a house, went to church, and began talking about having a child together. They cared for Binod's two children from his previous marriage, while expanding their auto shop, hiring local mechanics and offering special discounts to refugees and veterans. That is how Jackson Stewart, 25, came

to know Binod. His parents' car broke down in town, and when they told Binod their son was looking for mechanic experience, he offered an internship without hesitation. "He took a chance on me," Stewart said. It paid little, but Stewart learned a lot. "He was a great teacher and a great leader. He always made jokes and made us feel comfortable." In October 2024. Stewart proudly posted on Facebook that he had completed his second engine removal. Weeks later, Trump was elected president again, after campaigning on the promise of ruthless mass deportation of undocumented people in the US, particularly those with a criminal background. In Idaho, he won 67% of voters, including members of Stephanie's family (Stephanie declined to say how she voted). Randall and Diane voted for Trump, as did Stewart and many of Binod's customers and coworkers. In spite of the looming deportation order, they did not think Binod, a refugee, would be caught in Trump's anti-immigrant dragnet.

Within hours of taking office in January, Trump signed executive orders halting refugee admissions. His administration moved to end birthright citizenship and vastly expanded anti-immigration enforcement. Soon, ICE raids spread beyond workplaces and homes into restaurants, courthouses and even hospitals.

In early March, the Shahs received a phone call from an ICE agent ordering Binod to appear for removal proceedings. Binod, believing his cooperation might make a difference, got ready to make the drive to the ICE center in Tacoma. Stephanie, meanwhile, hoped that the immigration judge would take the letters of support from Twin Falls neighbors and community leaders - 16 had been written on Binod's behalf - and the parole officer's positive report into consideration and see that "he deserved a second chance.'

"He always did what the court asked of him," Stephanie said, her voice firm. "The law can be strict, but we have to remember the human condition. We have to have compassion."

But before they left, Binod broke down, telling Stephanie that he feared never seeing her or their son again - the

On 3 June, more than two months later, the worst happened. Binod called Stephanie from an ICE agent's phone: he was at the New Delhi airport, about to board a flight to Bhutan. ICE had begun deporting resettled Bhutanese refugees - a move Bhutan briefly complied with, only to immediately expel them to the Indian border.

towards Tacoma.

"Watching the current administration's mass deportation strategy has been damaging to refugee protection," said Kelly Ryan, president of Jesuit Refugee Service USA, who formerly worked at the state department's bureau of population, refugees and migration. "US law does recognize that people who commit crimes can be subject to removal, and we're not disputing the wisdom of that law. What we're saving is that people are being sent back to situations where they can't work, integrate locally, gain citizenship or access territorial rights - effectively rendering them stateless after having held status in a first country of asylum." ICE confirmed to the Guardian in a statement that Binod was removed from the US on 31 March due to his criminal record. "Let me be clear, illegal aliens who commit heinous crimes in this country will be swiftly removed from American communities," said Emily Covington, assistant director in the ICE office of public affairs. ICE did not respond to questions regarding the safety of sending refugees back to countries from which they were expelled. According to Pew, nearly 97% of Americans support deporting those who have committed violent crimes: it is a bipartisan policy. It is also a process that turns one sentence into two: people serve their time, only to be handed over to ICE for deportation. Justice advocates call it a "double punishment" that treats immigrants as disposable even after they have paid their debt to society, and argue for limited cooperation between state prisons and jails and federal immigration authorities.

Stephanie could hear the noise of the terminal behind Binod, the heaviness in his breathing, as he prepared to return to the same country that had uprooted him and tortured and imprisoned thousands, including his father. "He loved this country, America, more than anyone else," she said, "but he's the one who was deported."

Stakes rise as Trump deploys world's largest aircraft carrier to the Caribbean

When Donald Trump started sending warships, marines and reaper drones to the Caribbean in Hugo Chávez's 62-year-old heir joked August to torment Nicolás Maduro. > The prospect of a US military intervention in South America's fifth most populous nation has delighted some of Maduro's only way of breaking his 12-year grip on power. In a recent interview with

Maria Corina Machado, who has lived in hiding since Maduro was accused of stealing last year's presidential election from her movement, said her team had made plans for what to do after his fall. "We are ready to take over government. We have the teams, we have the plans - the first 100 hours, the first 100 days," she said.

But there are also profound fears about the possible consequences of overthrowing Maduro's regime and further destabilizing an already impoverished, politically divided and often lawless country.

Elías Ferrer, the founder of the Venezuela-focused advisory firm Orinoco Research, said one concern was the potential for a "Libya scenario", recalling how the North African country slipped into civil war in the years after the 2011 killing of its leader, Muammar Gaddafi.

Neighbouring Colombia, which has spent decades battling querrilla groups, offers another cautionary tale. Those Colombian insurgents were never strong enough to seize control of major cities such as Bogotá, Cali or Medellín. "But you can't get rid of them either.? They just keep lurking around?," Ferrer said, warning that, post-Maduro, a similar conflict could grip Venezuela, where many regions already resembled "the wild west".

Gedan believed that while some Venezuela hawks were rooting for a repeat of the 1989 invasion of Panama, they would be better served studying the US's 20-year quagmire in Afghanistan. "The reality is that [Venezuela] has a lot more in common with Afghanistan than with

Toppling Maduro would not be a political enemies, who consider it the simple task, Gedan warned. "And it certainly would be enormously complex to put Venezuela back together.'



Duffy: Newsom 'Caught Red-Handed' on 17,000 Illegal Trucking Licenses

The Biden-era sanctuary state policies in California foisted on the state and Americans by Democrat Gov. Gavin Newsom have once again collided with federal law — this time on America's highways.

The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has admitted to illegally issuing 17,000 commercial driver's licenses (CDLs) to foreign nationals who were not legally eligible to hold them, Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy announced Tuesday.

"After weeks of claiming they did nothing wrong, Gavin Newsom and California have been caught red-handed," Duffy wrote in a statement. "Now that we've exposed their lies, 17,000 illegally issued trucking licenses are being revoked.

"This is just the tip of the iceberg. My team will continue to force California to prove they have removed every illegal immigrant from behind the wheel of semitrucks and school buses."

A spokesperson for Newsom responded in a statement to Newsmax:

"Once again, the Sean 'Road Rules' Duffy fails to share the truth — spreading easily disproven falsehoods in a sad and desperate attempt to please his dear leader."

The federal crackdown requires the state to revoke the licenses or face steep financial penalties.

According to Duffy, the exposure came after an audit by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) found systemic violations in California's licensing

process — violations that allowed non-domiciled, and in many cases undocumented, individuals to obtain credentials to operate heavy commercial vehicles, including semitrucks and school buses.

The Department of Transportation confirmed official notices have been sent to all 17,000 holders, warning them their licenses no longer meet federal standards and will automatically expire within 60 days.

California is also being required to submit a full audit of its non-domiciled CDL program so federal regulators can verify that every illegal license has been canceled — and to ensure the same policy failures do not recur.

The FMCSA's investigation uncovered "systemic policy, procedural, and programming errors" in California's non-domiciled CDL system. These lapses allowed licenses to be issued to individuals whose legal stay in the U.S. had expired — or in some cases, who had no verified legal status at all.

The audit found more than 25% of CDL records sampled in California failed to comply with federal law, including instances where licenses extended far beyond the driver's work authorization period.

Critics have long accused Newsom of using state agencies to shield illegal immigrants from federal enforcement.

California remains one of the few states openly granting standard driver's licenses to illegal residents — but now the DMV appears to have gone even further, handing out commercial licenses that allow operation

of 40-ton trucks on interstate routes.

This latest violation compounds California's growing conflict with federal regulators. In October, the Department of Transportation announced it was withholding \$40 million in federal funds after finding that the state had failed to comply with mandatory English language proficiency (ELP) standards for commercial drivers.

The agency has now warned Sacramento that up to \$160 million in federal highway funds could be pulled unless the state brings its licensing programs into full compliance.

The report also noted the California Highway Patrol publicly declared in July that it had "no intention" of enforcing the federal English-language requirement for truckers — a position Duffy slammed as reckless.


In May, he ordered stricter nationwide enforcement of ELP rules, emphasizing that any commercial motor vehicle operator who cannot communicate in English will be placed out of service.

With 17,000 illegal CDLs now revoked, Duffy says the Department's mission is clear: hold California accountable and restore integrity to the nation's transportation system.

"This isn't about politics," Duffy said.
"It's about safety — and about the rule of law." Duffy's investigatory exposé comes as the Democrat-forced government shutdown has kept him busy dealing with air traffic control crisis nationwide, showing the self-admitted Democrat obstruction has been flooding the zone against the Trump administration in many different ways and industries.
