



### The United Kingdom may be planning to ban foreign students from bringing family

(By Staff Reporter) The United Kingdom is spouses and children -- up from 16.047 in from bringing immediate family members like spouses and children unless they study "high-value" degrees. As per a news report published in The Times, only international students studying science, mathematics, and engineering will be able to bring their dependents to the UK. Foreign students would also be banned from bringing families unless they are studying at a higher level, such as a master's degree or PhD, the report added. Britain has registered a near-eightfold rise in the number of family members joining foreign students. As per the immigration figures, nearly 5 lakh students were given visas last year. They were accompanied by 135,788 dependants --

planning to restrict international students 2019. Of these, India became the largest source of students with 161,000 students, including 33,240 dependents, coming to the UK last year. Asylum backlog hit a record high, with more than 160,000 migrants waiting for decisions on their applications, the report said. Home Secretary Suella Braverman has drawn up proposals to reduce the number, which includes shortening the duration foreign students can stay in Britain post their course. However, according to the Department of Education, the restrictions will bankrupt UK universities, which depend on foreign students for money. According to estimates, international students add 35 billion pounds a year to the economy.

### Can Germany become the next big destination for Indian techies?

(By Staff Reporter) Germany is looking to speed up the issuance of visas and is drawing up new legislation to make the country more attractive to foreign workers. The new law aims to address key hurdles for migrants to Germany, including the complex process for the recognition of educational credentials. Germany, like industrialised countries around the world, is facing deep labour shortages, particularly in skilled high-

growth sectors, which are taking their toll on an economy that could yet face a recession this year. German Chancellor Olaf Scholz said that his government wants to ease the path for Indian IT experts to obtain work visas in Germany. "We want to simplify the issuing of visas. We intend to modernize the whole bureaucratic process in addition to legal modernization," Scholz said while visiting Bengaluru on Sunday.

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# Major Social Media Push for Amritpal Singh by ISI, Targeting Young Sikhs: Intel Sources

(News Agency) Amajor social media push has been given by Pakistan's intelligence agency ISI through indirect funding routes to Khalistani separatist Amritpal Singh from Canada, the United Kingdom, and other countries, top intelligence sources told CNN-News18 on Monday. Facebook and Instagram accounts are uploading thousands of pictures of purported suppression of Sikhs in India, they said.

They are advertised also and these ads can be seen in Canada, the UK, and Germany, said the sources. According to the sources, these ads are designed in such a way that they are only going to the accounts of young Sikhs between 18-25 years of age. They said these ads are targeted toward Sikh names



and surnames like Singh, Kaur, etc. These ads are paid for and running for almost a year, they added. They directly reach the targeted viewers in terms of showing atrocities, selling garments with images of Sikh atrocities, car accessories, etc, said the sources. The intelligence sources said those involved are creating millions of dollars for funding. These ads are directly linking Sikh secessionist leader Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale with Amritpal Singh, they said.

### **Remarks Against PM: SC Extends Interim Bail of Congress** Leader Pawan Khera Till March 3



(News Agency) The Supreme Court on Monday extended till March 3 the interim bail granted to Congress leader Pawan Khera in a case related to his alleged objectionable remarks against Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The Assam Police had last week arrested Khera in the case. A three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud took note of the submissions of Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Assam, that the state police wanted to file its reply. Additional Advocate General Garima Prasad, appearing for Uttar Pradesh, also said that she will also be filing the response in the matter. The bench took note of the submissions and fixed Khera's plea for hearing on March 3 making it clear that the interim bail, granted to him on February 23, will remain in force till then. Khera was arrested at the Delhi airport after being deplaned from a flight to Raipur in connection with his alleged remarks against Modi, made at a press conference on February 17 at Mumbai.He was later granted bail by a Magisterial court in Delhi.





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# United States Files Complaint Against Illegal Robocall Telemarketers and Telecommunications Service Providers

(By Staff Reporter) The Justice include numerous "ringless voicemails" failing to clearly and truthfully identify the Department, together with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), today announced a civil enforcement action against several corporate and individual defendants for alleged violations of the FTC Act and the Telemarketing Sales Rule (TSR) in connection with telemarketing campaigns that have illegally bombarded American consumers with millions of robocalls. According to a complaint filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California. defendant telecommunications service companies Stratics Networks, Inc. and Netlatitude Inc., along with defendant Kurt Hannigan, Netlatitude's president, violated the TSR by providing substantial assistance and support in the form of technological services to telemarketers that unlawfully called consumers with robocalls delivering prerecorded marketing messages, called numbers listed on the National Do Not Call Registry, and failed to truthfully identify the seller of the goods and services being marketed. These alleged robocalls

delivered to consumers without making their phones ring. The complaint also brings claims against several additional

Networks, Inc.'s ringless voicemail platform to illegally telemarket creditcard debt relief services. According to the complaint, defendants Tek Ventures, LLC (also doing

business as Provident Solutions), Atlas Marketing Partners, Inc., Atlas Investment Ventures, LLC, Eric Petersen and Todd DiRoberto (who are co-owners of those three companies), Kasm, and Kenan Azzeh (owner and director of Kasm) violated the FTC Act by misrepresenting the terms and outcomes of their debt relief services. These defendants also violated the TSR by making those misrepresentations, by

seller of their services, and by calling consumers with prerecorded messages without first obtaining their consent. The defendants that allegedly used Stratics complaint also alleges that defendants

Tek Ventures, LLC, Marketing Partners, Inc., Atlas Investment Ventures, LLC, Eric Petersen, Todd DiRoberto, and two additional defendants - Ace **Business Solutions** LLC and its owner and director Sandra Barnes

- violated the TSR by requesting and receiving payments from their debt relief customers before renegotiating or otherwise altering the terms of those customers' debts. The complaint seeks permanent injunction to prohibit the defendants from future violations, as well as monetary civil penalties and relief to redress injury caused to consumers.

Two defendants in this action, Kasm and its owner and director Kenan Azzeh, have

agreed to entry of a court order that resolves the claims against them. The stipulated order, if entered by the court. would prohibit these defendants from further violations and impose a monetary judgment of \$3,380,000, suspended to \$7,500 due to their limited ability to pay. "The Department of Justice is committed to stopping individuals and companies from making illegal robocalls and peddling predatory debt relief services," said Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General Brian M. Boynton, head of the Justice Department's Civil Division, "We will continue to work with the FTC to enforce the FTC Act and the Telemarketing Sales Rule against those who use misleading sales tactics to prev on consumers." "This case targets the ecosystem of companies who perpetrate illegal telemarketing to cheat American consumers who are struggling financially," said Director Samuel Levine of the FTC's Bureau of Consumer Protection. "The FTC will continue to take aggressive action to protect consumers from the scourge of illegal robocalls."

# Man Pleads Guilty to \$55M Investment Fraud Scheme

(By Staff Reporter) A Florida man pleaded guilty today to orchestrating an investment fraud scheme that defrauded more than 10.000 victims documents, Michael Glaspie,

72, of Palm City, marketed an investment opportunity under the name "CoinDeal" or "Coin Deal." Glaspie claimed that CoinDeal would yield extremely high returns on the premise that one

or more technology companies - operated under the banner of "ViRSE" and allegedly owned by Neil Suresh Chandran - was about to be acquired by a consortium of wealthy buyers. To entice investors to put money into CoinDeal, Glaspie falsely promised that in the event the returns from CoinDeal failed to materialize, he would repay investors their money with seven percent annual interest over three years. In fact, Glaspie knew he had no means of making such repayments.

(SAI Bureau) A federal grand jury in Charlotte returned an indictment yesterday charging a North Carolina man with masterminding and directing a massive scheme to deceive state insurance regulators and defraud thousands of policyholders and others in connection with insurance companies he controlled. According to court documents, from no later than 2016 through at least 2019, Greq E. Lindberg, 53, of Durham, and others allegedly agreed to defraud various insurance companies, other third parties, and ultimately, thousands of insurance

the North Carolina Department of Insurance and other regulators, evaded regulatory requirements meant to protect policyholders, concealed the true financial condition of his insurance companies, and improperly used insurance company funds for his personal benefit. In particular, the indictment alleges that Lindberg personally benefitted from the fraud in part by using insurance company funds to finance his lavish lifestyle, including the purchase and refinancing of personal real estate and "forgiving" more than \$125

policyholders. Lindberg allegedly deceived million in loans from his affiliated companies to himself. "Policyholders rely on insurance company owners to follow the rules so that the benefits they deserve and depend on will be available when needed," said Assistant Attorney General Kenneth A. Polite, Jr. of the Justice Department's Criminal Division. "In this alleged \$2 billion scheme, the defendant defrauded regulators and policyholders alike, causing substantial financial harm thousands of victims. As this prosecution demonstrates, no matter how complex the scheme, the department will

hold accountable corporate executives whose crimes leave policyholders holding the bag while lining their own pockets." The charged conduct allegedly caused substantial financial hardship to the victims. Lindberg allegedly caused the insurance companies to engage in investments of nearly \$2 billion as part of his scheme, most of which remained outstanding as of September 2022. Since 2019, multiple insurance companies controlled by Lindberg have been placed into rehabilitation or liquidation.

# This is the price China must pay for unleashing COVID on the world

Department of Energy, now agree that COVID-19 likely emerged from a leak at the Wuhan Institute of Virology. Since the Energy Department's assessment is based on new information which will be shared, other official groups will presumably arrive at the same conclusion.

Suppose that a year from now U.S. intel agencies agree that the Chinese government created COVID-19 in a laboratory, lied about it and withheld information that allowed the deadly virus to run riot across the globe. What should President Biden do? How should China be held accountable for nearly seven million deaths worldwide and untold economic destruction?

China must pay a price. Biden will have to assemble a coalition of countries finally willing to push back against China's carelessness and deception about COVID-19, as well as its ongoing theft of intellectual property, disregard for human rights, dishonest posturing about climate change and economic coercion. It is time. For over a decade the free world, in thrall to the economic opportunities of a growing China, has looked the other way as Beijing has allowed rampant cyberattacks, stolen billions of dollars in patents and know-how, lied about its military ambitions in the South China Sea and elsewhere, and cheated on international rules and standards

Despite being a member of the World Trade Organization, which prohibits such activities, China routinely punishes other countries for what they view as hostile measures by blackballing imports of that nation's goods. For instance, when officials in Canberra barred Huawei and ZTE from its 5G network and demanded a strenuous investigation into the origins of COVID-19, China retaliated by banning imports of Australian coal, beef, copper, wine, lobsters, beer and other key goods. Such moves are meant to weaken antagonistic countries, but both sides can play that game. The U.S. and its allies could similarly target and ban goods from China that can be bought elsewhere, which would not only punish Beijing's interests but also accelerate the exodus of manufacturers from China.

The same coalition could also demand that China be booted from the World Trade Organization and the World Health Organization. Yes, globalists would squeal, but China does not abide by the rules of these organizations. Instead, Beijing has manipulated them for its own interests. As a member of the WHO, China should have immediately shared valuable information about COVID-19 that might have accelerated the development of therapeutics and a vaccine. It also should have allowed a thorough and timely investigation of the pandemic's origins. It did neither. China should also be dropped from the G-20, which describes itself as "the premier forum for international economic cooperation." China does not

In May 2020, the highly regarded "Z Division" or intelligence arm of the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory issued a classified report suggesting that a lab leak was a real possibility.

> When a team led by the World Health Organization visited Wuhan in early 2021, the Chinese blocked the investigation. The international group of researchers were not allowed to speak to the people working at the WIV and were only briefly permitted inside the facility. The government also refused to share with the investigators any data on experiments, safety records or any other pertinent information about the operations of the lab. The WHO basically caved to China's argument that the lab was not responsible. Nonetheless, the Danish scientist who led the WHO team suggested months later that the possibility of a lab accident merited further investigation, to which the Chinese never agreed.

## Ajnala violence points to importance of preempting conflict. Learn from Operation Blue Star

The recent episode in Punjab's Ajnala where radical activist Amritpal Singh and his supporters stormed a police station and injured six officers—reminds some of the unfortunate events that preceded and instigated Punjab's submergence in a fathomless quagmire of terrorism in the 1980s. The Punjab imbroglio began in 1978 with a clash between the Sant Nirankari Mission and traditional Sikhs, two religious bodies that eventually pushed Punjab into a decade of violence. This bloody conflict was followed by a long gestation period of about six years before former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi staged 'Operation Blue Star' in 1984. To the uninitiated, this military operation was meant to remove Damdami Taksal leader Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale and his followers from the Golden Temple premises in Amritsar. Reportedly "prominent heads of the Khalistan movement", they sought shelter at the Gurudwara to evade arrest by Indian intelligence agencies. While the Puniab government has responded more promptly this time, there are lessons to learn from our past.

Before Operation Blue Star, no substantive pre-emptive measures were taken to diffuse Punjab's smouldering, volatile environment. This lack of foresight had disastrous implications for the state. Total apathy on the part of custodians of law, and the casual approach of political stakeholders in seeking a viable solution to the problem allowed such events to go unchecked. This callousness eventually caused Operation Blue Star, which scarred the collective syncretic psyche of Punjab. Punjab moving toward '80s-like violence Much of the clues behind the rise of terror in Punjab lie in the mercurial corridors of its power politics, which have remained unexplored since before the Army entered the scene in 1984. It seems that the political developments in Punjab are once again being left to themselves, allowing the distinct possibility of their unchecked meandering into an '80s-like confrontational paradigm. It is vulnerable to the machinations of inimical-not necessarily all foreign-forces If left unattended, its problems can precipitously assume daunting proportions. Roots of Waris Punjab De

The Amritpal Singh Sidhu-led 'Waris Punjab De' gained prominence during the 2020 farm law agitation. It has been in the news since last year, when he took over slain founder Deep Sidhu's role. Before leading the pro-Khalistan organisation, Amritpal looked after his family's transport business in Dubai. Since his take over he has expanded the organisation's operations to 'end troubles and long pending issues of the Sikh Panth'.

The Ajnala incident needs to be located within the broader context of various public utterances by Amritpal, and the absence of responses by the state government and other social, political, and religious bodies. When Amritpal and his supporters stormed a police station to get their associate, Lovepreet Singh 'Toofan', released from police custody on 23 February, law enforcement diligently undertook precautionary measures to prevent it from swelling into communal conflict. This action is important, especially when the overdrawn 2015 bargari biadbi (desecration of Sri Guru Granth Sahib) incidents remain under investigation. The current regime's move is politically correct, and a contrary stance could easily have led to an inflammatory situation with massive deterioration of law and order. If some harm was done to the Palki of Sri Guru Granth Sahib in a hypothetical retaliatory action by the police, it could have led to serious communal implications, given the utmost spiritual status of the sacred scriptures.



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# Republicans Can't Wait for Trump to Implode

### He's weaker than he's been in years — yet still tops the 2024 field.

Donald Trump has had a terrible couple of months — and still leads national polls for the Republican nomination handily. Almost everything that he's done lately really, everything since he's left office should redound to his discredit, and yet he remains in a relatively strong position. That he could take a large hand in blowing the 2022 mid-terms follow that up with a limp campaign announcement, immerse himself in bizarre and unnecessary controversies (pass the ketchup, Kanye), attack an up-and-coming Republican governor in crude and sophomoric terms, and not just live to tell the tale, but stay at the head of the pack may be the most astonishing testament to the power of his political brand vet.

All sorts of caveats are necessary. It's still very early in a late-developing race. There are only two current or former officeholders in the race, Trump and Nikki Haley. There's no doubt that Trump has taken on water, and is at his weakest since sometime in the first part of 2016.Ron DeSantis has tended to do better against Trump in head-to-head polling (although he trails in a new Yahoo poll), and Trump has looked vulnerable in all-important lowa and

Finally, we'll have to see where candidates as necessary. DeSantis settles in the polling, if and when he actually gets in the race. All that said, unless Trump's support in surveys is a complete mirage, he continues to have a formidable grip on the GOP. There's been a lot of buzz about DeSantis, understandably, who's done all the right things to establish a national brand win credibility with populists, and cultivate big donors. But there should be no mistake regarding Trump's leadership of the party, he can set up like the Texans defending their canon at the Battle of Gonzales and defy his adversaries to "come and take it."

That is a daunting prospect. It's one thing to imagine supplanting Trump as he slip-slides away, defeating himself with his own obsessions and animosities; it's another to figure out a way to topple him, to come up with lines of attack that diminish him and convince his voters to go elsewhere. Since he first entered the race in 2015, Trump has benefited from a natural sense of command. What he's lacked in policy depth or in dignity, he's made up with his considerable personal force and authority. In the 2016 primary debates, he was the tall, orange-hued man standing in the middle of the stage, hushing the other

In the current developing field, he's obviously the only former president and the only one with a track record of winning (and losing) at the national level. He's the creator of the movement that nearly everyone else wants to take over or, at the very least, accommodate. He's the dominant force the one whose standing in the race affects. everything, and, importantly, the one everyone fears. The latter quality is a key part of the Trump phenomenon. Other national figures might out-charm their competition (Barack Obama in 2008) or overwhelm them with resources (George W. Bush in 2000, Hillary Clinton in 2016). Trump's MO is to bludgeon them with highly personal, belittling attacks, in a way that has proven highly effective in the past and quite unpleasant to the targets Nikki Haley had a pretty good launch a couple of weeks ago but among her weakest moments were when she was clearly frightened to say anything at all about Trump, including mentioning a policy difference or two

Mike Pence has been more forthright, although even he has leveled criticisms in oblique terms. Ron DeSantis, the target of a flurry of initial jabs from Trump, has

shrugged them off or parried with very subtle counterpunches. None of this is irrational. Why would Haley want to become the subject of Trump's ire at a time when she's the only other major politician in the race? Pence can wait to prosecute his case more directly if he launches a campaign. DeSantis is trying to push his own message most recently on his book tour and put more points on the board in the coming Florida legislative session — a mud fight with Trump now isn't in his interest. Yet, the disinclination to engage with Trump at all brings back memories of 2016. If it's a temporary dynamic, that's one thing; if it's another prisoner's dilemma among the non-Trump candidates, waiting for someone else to take him on and hoping to emerge unscathed in the aftermath, it's repeating the same mistake and expecting a different result. If the current situation holds, there's no way around Trump — only through and that will require making a case against him. # How are Chinese discussing Pakistan economic woes? State media quiet, social media buzzing

## Chinese commentators have said that there are limits to how much Beijing can help. But China also wants the US to stay out of the current crisis in Pakistan

China has so far only tacitly forex reserves by about 20 per cent. acknowledged the economic crisis brewing in Pakistan. The state media continues to talk about the strengths of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. But Chinese people on social media are asking questions about the future of Pakistan's economy and the reliability of the 'iron brotherhood' relationship with Islamabad. Pakistan's defence minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif boldly stated on 19 February that the country has become bankrupt. The confession piqued the interest of Chinese people who only see their state media maintain radio silence on it.

The hashtags "Pakistan bankruptcy" and "Pakistan Defence Minister says the country is bankrupt" briefly trended on the Chinese social media platform Weibo. But they didn't pick up traction as Beijing continues to play down the severity of the economic crisis in Pakistan

### **Growing Chinese debt**

Pakistan owes \$30 billion to the Chinese government and its financial institutions, which is just 30 per cent of its total foreign debt. The country also owes the IMF, the World Bank, and the Asia Development Bank.

If that wasn't enough, China Development Bank recently announced a \$700 million loan to boost Pakistan's

Despite there being relative silence on the economic crisis, some experts in China have said that Beijing will help

"At present, Pakistan does face risks similar to Sri Lanka, but I think it is unlikely that it will go bankrupt because China, Saudi Arabia, and other countries are all helping Pakistan. The problem now is that the IMF loan has not been implemented," wrote Liu Zongyi, secretary-general of the Shanghai Institutes for International Studies.

Wang Yi, director of the CCP Central Foreign Affairs Commission alluded to the economic difficulties during his recent meeting with Pakistan's foreign affairs minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari in

'China firmly supports Pakistan in maintaining security and stability as well as achieving development and revitalisation, and stands ready to provide assistance within its ability to help Pakistan overcome temporary difficulties," said Wang Yi in Munich on 17 February.

Chinese citizens, though, have argued for the need to help Pakistan because it will reduce pressure on India - something perceived as unfavourable for China

"The current situation in Pakistan is

indeed very bad. The economy is on the much Beijing can help. Pakistan will verge of bankruptcy, the political oligarchs hold power, and there is friction with Afghanistan on the border. If Pakistan is in chaos, the pressure on India will be greatly reduced, which is not good for our country" wrote a Weibo user from Shanghai.

### China's support not limitless

China's support for Pakistan's economic crisis isn't limitless and some doubts have emerged about how far Beijing should go with its assistance.

Pakistan's ambivalent actions in the Russia-Ukraine war have raised doubts about Islamabad's 'iron brotherhood' with Beijing. The rumours about Pakistan supplying weapons to Ukraine were discussed by independent Chinese commentators.

People in China have asked if the "iron brotherhood" relationship with Pakistan is as strong as perceived. "Why is Batie no longer iron?" is one of the popular Pakistan-related search terms on Baidu, 'Batie' roughly translates to 'iron brother'.

Though the reports about Pakistan supplying weapons to Ukraine are unconfirmed, they have added to the doubts about Pakistan's politics and fragile economic position.

Chinese commentators have underscored that there are limits to how



Worryingly, generative models have massive ethical implications. Generative AI models are destructive to the environment and can contribute significantly to global warming, by needing enormous amounts of energy. For instance, training a generative AI model just once with 213 million parameters can spew CO2 equivalent to that of 125 New York-Beijing round flight trips; and GPT3 has 175 billion parameters.

An article in The Guardian revealed that data centers currently consume 200 terawatt hours per year, roughly equal to what South Africa does; by 2030 this could equal Japan's power consumption. Generative AI models also plagiarise content. Getty Images is suing Stable Diffusion in the London High Court, accusing it of illegally using its images without its permission. If we ask a model like Stable Diffusion to combine multiple images (sav. an MF Hussain-style Mona Lisa), who owns it - you, the Al model, Hussain, or Leonardo da Vinci whose original compositions were squashed together? Also, ChatGPT could potentially replace jobs - a 'generate' button could theoretically substitute artists, photographers, and graphic designers. The model is not really

creating art or textual content, it is just crunching and manipulating data and it has no idea or sense of what and why it is doing so. But if it can do so well enough, cheaply, and at scale, customers would shrug their shoulders and use it. Most worryingly, these models are intrinsically biased. The model has been trained on sources like Reddit and Wikipedia - 67% of Reddit users in US are men. less than 15% of Wikipedians are women - and these biases get reflected. While OpenAI has built ethical guardrails around ChatGPT, so that it does not spout racist or sexist content, Al expert Gary Marcus says that these guardrails are thin, the model is amoral, and we are sitting on an ethical time bomb. This fact was comprehensively proven with the Roose conversation. The original ChatGPT does not crawl the web, but later versions (like the Bing integration) do, and the whole swampy morass that is the Internet is now open to it.

Well-known AI researcher Timnit Gebru was working with Google when she co-wrote an influential research paper calling the models like ChatGPT "stochastic parrots", because they just spouted words without understanding them. Similar to parrots, ChatGPT does not understand what it says, nor does it care. Gebru, Marcus and other scholars and academics have been repeatedly pointing out the dangers and limitations of Generative AI models, but their warnings are drowned out by the sheer excitement around ChatGPT. Gebru, in fact, was fired from Google shortly after she wrote her

# As Govt Issues Advisory for Heatwave, Here's Why the Phenomenon Occurs

(South Asian Insider Bureau) Awarning regarding the anticipated heatwave from March to May has been released by the Union Health Ministry. The "Dos and Don'ts" list was released as the Indian Meteorological Service issued its first heat advisory for 2023. The National Disaster Management Authority estimates that by 2020, there would have been 23 states affected by such waves, more than quadruple the number in 2015. Last March was the warmest India had seen in more than a century, with severe heat waves destroying harvests and resulting in widespread power outages. READ MORE on this here As per a report by the Hindu, the IMD had issued a warning the week of February 21 that maximum temperatures across northwest, west, and central India would be 3-5° C higher than the long-term normal. The national capital saw its third hottest February day (33.6° C) in more than five decades on February 21. And as per Kalinga TV, the temperature in some regions of the Odisha may reach 40 to 42 degrees in the first week of March. The report said temperature would rise by 3 to 5 degrees in most coastal and western portions of the state, and that the daytime temperature in North and South Odisha districts is predicted to rise by 2 to 4 degrees.

### IS A HEATWAVE COMING?

The early temperature rise is due to weak western disturbances and, as a result, less rainfall. Skymet Weather Services president GP Sharma told CNBC-TV18 that that temperatures are

### WHAT CAUSES **HEATWAVES?**

(South Asian Insider Bureau)

As per a report by Hindu, a study published in Nature Geoscience on February 20, 2023, provides insight into how many factors contribute to the production of a heat wave. The report adjusts the study's findings to the Indian context.In the spring, air usually comes in from the west-northwest. This is bad news for India for a number of reasons, the report says. In terms of climate change, the Middle East is warming faster than other regions with similar latitudes to the equator, and it acts as a source of warm air that blows towards India. Similarly, as air from the northwest rushes in over the mountains of Afghanistan and Pakistan, some compression occurs on the leeward side of these mountains, bringing prickly warmth into India, it says. Because land warms faster than the oceans, air coming in over the oceans is predicted to deliver cooler air (because the heat capacity of land is much lower). Unfortunately, the Arabian Sea is warming faster than the majority of other ocean basins.

The near-surface winds are then controlled by the powerful high atmospheric westerly winds that blow in from the Atlantic Ocean over to India in the spring. When winds blow from west to east, keep in mind that they are moving faster than the globe, which is also spinning from west to east.

# Afghan refugees in Pakistan protest delay in U.S. resettlement

Applicants who have been waiting more than a year and a half for U.S. officials to approve their visas are contending with economic hardship and lack of access to health, education and other services.

(South Asian Insider Bureau) ISLAMABAD — Hundreds of Afghan refugees facing extreme delays in the approval of U.S. visas protested in Pakistan's capital on Sunday, as an American program to help relocate atrisk Afghans fleeing Taliban rule stalls. The U.S. government's Priority 1 and Priority 2 refugee programs, known as P1 and P2, were meant to fast track visas for at-risk Afghans including journalists and rights activists after the Taliban takeover in their homeland. Those eligible must have worked for the U.S. government, a U.S.-based media organization or nongovernmental organization in Afghanistan, and must be referred by the U.S.-based employer.

Applicants have been waiting in Pakistan for more than one and a half years for U.S. officials to process their visa applications. The delay in approving visas and resettlement has left Afghan applicants in a highly vulnerable position as they contend with economic hardship and lack of access to health, education and services

Under U.S. rules, applicants must first relocate to a third country for their cases to be processed, where it initially can take up to 14 to 18 months and cases are processed through the resettlement support centers.

economic decoupling would almost certainly cause domestic political volatility. This would make both sides' foreign policies more unpredictable, and probably more belligerent.

Meanwhile. America would have to finance an arms buildup not just in Europe, but also in Asia. This would create an even heavier fiscal burden in America, hence higher taxes and more inflationary pressure. If China divested from its massive dollar holdings, which seems likely, the fiscal situation would get even worse.

Yet another difference is that many US allies would struggle to pay their own defense bills and still maintain economic separation from China. In fact, they might not even want to. Whereas Soviet ideology called for an overthrow of their liberal political systems and the appropriation of bourgeois property, China's ideology today poses no such threat.

Especially in the early years of a new cold war, the risk of an accidental war would be high. Early cold war crisis, for example over Berlin in 1948, almost led to war before cooler heads prevailed. There is no guarantee that a crisis today would also be resolved peaceably. Both sides'

Creating strategic stability - a situation in which neither side has an incentive to start a nuclear war - is already going to be complicated enough in a world where China and Russia are both likely to have superpower-sized nuclear arsenals. The leftist historians of the world dismiss Tipu's cruelty to British prisoners, including the forcible dressing of young drummer boys as girls and the violation of their civil rights as "imperialist propaganda." It definitely was propaganda. But let us not forget the kernel of truth in these accounts.

> The so-called secular historians talk endlessly about Tipu's support of the Hindu temples of Srirangapatna and Nanjangud and of the Sringeri Mutt. Many of these are documented and cannot and should not be denied. But if the historians are neutral, they should have the integrity and courage to state that some of this support stemmed from Tipu's faith in these temples possessing unique abilities in the realm of astrological predictions. Tipu was a believer in astrology. I give him credit for that. Will secular historians do the same?

# A brilliant tactician but a weak strat-

The other point that the Marxist historians make is that Purnaiah, who was a Brahmin and a minister under Hyder Ali and Tipu, was pro-Tipu. This is true. But the same historians could have and should have added that many Mysoreans believed and still do that Purnaiah was a Church in India will even bother to talk traitor a few times over! explanation. Purnaiah was perhaps a nobody until Hyder spotted him and his entire rise, including becoming the Diwan of Mysore, was on account of Hyder and later Tipu. He was simply being loyal to his benefactors. Incidentally, in his later life, Purnaiah was equally loyal to the East India Company. Arthur Wellesley, who later became the Duke of Wellington, respected and admired Purnaiah. My grand-uncle Nagaraia Rao, a devout Brahmin himself, while talking about Purnaiah once told me that "Brahmins have a chameleon-like ability to adjust realistically to the powers that be." That might sum up the Purnaiah story. Not loyalty or disloyalty, but realism.

Tipu called his government (which from our family's point of view, was one of usurpers) the Sarkar-E-Khudadad, an Islamic Persian expression indicating that it was the government of God. Tipu deliberately introduced Persian into the land records of his dominion. Is it bigoted on our part to admire the British army officer Mark Cubbon who subsequently changed the rules and reintroduced Kannada and Marathi in the village maps? Who is the traitor? Who is the patriot? Who was benevolent? Who was malevolent? Important questions to ask. No wonder, even today, no political party wants to change

the name of Cubbon Park in Bengaluru or remove his statue. The fact is Tipu was a brilliant military tactician and a weak military and political strategist. He allied with the French, who ended up on the losing side. He was bigoted and had megalomaniac pretensions of a Muslim conquest of India. Hence his outreach to the Turks and the Afghans. He was a parvenu local Muslim and anathema to the Nizam who advertised his Persian ancestry. The Marathas saw him as a thorn in their side. The Nawab of Carnatic Muhammad Ali Khan Wallajah hated Tipu and was his unforgiving enemy. Many of Tipu's subjects longed for the return of Wodevar rule

Hyder Ali was a military and political genius but his son Tipu, lacked his good sense. He allowed a large coalition—the Marathas, the Nizam, the British, the Kodavas, the Maharaja of Travancore and the Nawab of Carnatic to get together against him. He relied on the French who were irresolute and incompetent; he appealed to Turks and Afghans who were otherwise preoccupied and uninterested. He was clever. But unlike his father, he was not intelligent. He lost.

In any event, he was not a great, shining patriot. He was flawed, like most

# More Indians plan on moving abroad in next 2 yrs: Survey

Indians are displaying strong intention to move to another country as across age groups, the preference to move abroad is the highest in India when compared to global respondents, the latest report by CBRE South Asia said.

According to the survey, around 16% have already relocated in the past two years, while 17% of Indians are planning to relocate in the next two years. The survey also found respondents displayed a stronger intention to move to a new home in the next two years -- 44% vs 31% in the previous two years, which is significantly higher when compared to both global and APAC respondents.

The survey highlights that India's residential sector saw unprecedented growth in the past two years, primarily due to strong policy push and incentives such as stamp duty waivers, and lower home mortgage rates, coupled with attractive discounts and schemes rolled out by developers.

### Global Media's False Narratives Nagaland Verdict Repudiates

The "democracy in danger" false narrative on India that has been in circulation for some time now, within certain sections of the global media, has to a large extent drawn itself from a ranking of global democracies published by the Sweden Institute V-Dem. Ahead of its latest rankings for 2023, set to be released later today, an interesting paper has been shared by Professor Salvatore Babones from the University of Sydney. The paper published through the India Century Roundtable takes an in-depth look at both the methodology and the source data relied upon by V-Dem to point out several inherent flaws. Pointing out how the index fails to make a distinction between single-party authoritarian states and vibrant multiparty democracies, the India Century Roundtable paper elucidates the problems with the flawed indicators. chosen by the index that results in questionable rankings, where authoritarian Hong Kong scores high while the world's largest democracy is penalised. The global media's false narratives in India have gained several decibels in volume over the past several. weeks with 2023 being a significant year for Indian democracy. With several state assembly elections ahead of next year's general elections and the prestigious G20 Summit being held in India, the concerted attempts to tamper with Indian democracy were laid bare when billionaire George Soros went public on his intentions. The false narratives on India took a curious turn last week when multiple global media outlets sought to advance a narrative of women journalists in danger in India.

The issue brought to mind yet another flawed index around press freedom. It would be pertinent to note a recent observation by the Reuters Institute of Journalism (RISJ), during a seminar with award-winning Mexican Journalist Marcela Turati. Discussing in general and Mexico in specific, the RISJ observed how Mexico had seen more deaths of journalists than even wartime Ukraine and Syria. Describing Mexico as the most dangerous country for journalists, the RISJ noted how 2022 was the deadliest year for journalists in Latin America and how the region had become the most dangerous for journalism. Paradoxically, the Press Freedom Index 2022, released by Reporters Without Borders (RSF) ranks Mexico at 120 and India at 150. In fact, the summary of highlights released by the RSF makes no mention of Mexico or Latin America, making one wonder how the most-deadly country for such interventionist experiment by the

the safety of journalists in Latin America journalism and the most dangerous region for journalists has been glossed over Reporters Without Borders in their so-called index of press freedom This stark contrast between narratives of the RISJ in the UK and RSF in France, over their perception of the safety of journalists and freedom of the press, tells an untold story of how the Global South and developing democracies have become a petri-dish for interventionist experiments from the Global North and well-funded activists in search of causes. Thus, it should come as no surprise that the trigger for the latest narrative over the safety of women journalists in India comes from another

International Center for Journalists (ICFJ), undertaken in partnership with the University of Sheffield in the UK based on major UK government-funded project. It is quite rich of the British foreign secretary to bring up the issue of the BBC tax survey when it is his foreign office that has funded the ICFJ-Sheffield project behind the false narrative of women journalists in India being in danger.

Multiple false narratives on India, advanced by the global media have however, received a strong repudiation with the resounding verdict in the latest round of elections to multiple state assemblies and more specifically, the Nagaland Assembly.

# Dilbert cartoon dropped by US news papers over creator's racist comments

While we respect and encourage free speech, his views do not align with our editorial or business values as an organization "An executive at Cleveland's the Plain Dealer newspaper, Chris Quinn, said the decision to drop the strip was not "dif-

"We are not a home for those who espouse racism. We certainly do not want to provide them with financial support," Quinn said. "Until we decide what to replace Dilbert with, you'll likely see a gray box where it has been appearing."

The Anti-Defamation League called the phrase "It's OK to be White" a "hate symbol" and noted that it was popularized in 2017 as a trolling campaign by members of the notorious discussion forum 4chan. "Based on the current way things are going, the best advice I would give to white people is to get the hell away from Black people," the 65-year-old Adams said on his YouTube rant. "Just get the fuck away.

Because there's no fixing this. This can't be fixed. So I don't think it makes any sense as a white citizen of America to try to help Black citizens any more. It doesn't make sense. There's no longer a rational impulse. So I'm going to back off on being helpful to Black America because it doesn't seem like it pays off.'

His comments were picked up on social media, igniting demands that Adams's work be dropped by publishers who carried the comic strip

"In light of Scott Adams's recent statements promoting segregation, the Washington Post has ceased publication of the Dilbert comic strip." the newspaper's front office said on Saturday, also noting that readers had contacted the newspaper calling for the cartoon to be dropped. A statement from the Los Angeles Times, which said it had removed four Dilbert cartoons from its pages in recent months

"Wherever you have to go, just get away. for violations of its standards, added: "Cartoonist Scott Adams made racist comments in a YouTube livestream [on 22 February], offensive remarks that the Times rejects." The cartoonist has previously claimed that some of his projects have been canceled because he is white. In 2022, he introduced the first-ever Black character to Dilbert, dubbed Dave the Black Engineer, whom he used to mock the idea of workplace diversity and transgender identity. In June 2020, he referred to the cancellation of a Dilbert animated TV series 20 years ago as the "the third job I lost for being white". Thirteen months ago, in January 2022, Adams tweeted that was "going to self-identify as a Black woman" until Joe Biden picked his presidential nominee to the US supreme court. "I realize it's a long shot, but I don't want to completely take myself out of the conversation for the job," Adams said in that tweet.

# Finland wants to join NATO. But it may have to ditch an old friend to do so

friendships between nations, not much comes between Sweden and my home country of Finland.

We're not just neighbors; We are bound together by centuries of shared history. Parts of Finland were ruled for 500 years (sometimes uneasily, to be honest) by the kingdom of Sweden. And along with Finnish, Swedish is one of two official languages in Finland. Most Finns learn to speak the language passably well. In recent decades, our two countries have also been close military allies. In fact, Sweden is Finland's closest defense partner. The two countries have been cooperating on defense since the 1990s. That close military cooperation is one of the reasons why, when many other countries in northern and eastern Europe rushed to join NATO, Helsinki and Stockholm chose to remain outside. We felt we had our mutual defense needs covered visa-vis Russia

Finland also has robust military defenses which we developed as a matter of exigency, living in the shadow of a powerful Russian neighbor with whom we already went to war once before, back when it was part of the Soviet Union. Until one year ago, we





# 'Take It Down:' a tool for teens to remove explicit images

(SAI Bureau) "Once you send that an image, or another image of you, similar tool, although for adults, back extortion and exploitation has only photo, you can't take it back," goes I'm going to do X, Y, Z." the warning to teenagers, often ignoring the reality that many teens send explicit images of themselves duress, or understanding the consequences.

A new online tool aims to give level of involvement, they just want a brief period, but didn't expand it to some control back to teens, or people who were once teens, and take down explicit images and videos of themselves from the internet.

Called Take It Down, the tool is operated by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, and funded in part by Meta Platforms, the owner of Facebook and Instagram.

# 'Crafting an illusion': US rail firms' multimillion-dollar PR push

Six children, smiling and laughing, sit at a table with lunch boxes open in front of them. "Hey guys! My dad can stop a train with his finger," one brags. "My mom can see into the future," another says, holding up her hands as binoculars. "My mom? She speaks train," a third claims.Just then, her mom walks into the room. Another child asks if it's true that she can talk to trains. "You betcha," she says with a wink, as she stands in front of a sky-blue sign emblazoned with the logo of the Southern

Corporation. The kids' conversation takes place in "Everyday Superheroes", a 2018 video created for Norfolk Southern, the \$12.7bn operator of the train carrying toxic chemicals that derailed earlier this month in East Palestine, Ohio, causing an environmental disaster of still unknown proportions.

The video, part of an ad campaign called "Reimagine Possible", was produced by RP3, a Maryland-based public relations agency. RP3 said the campaign was designed to reach "policymakers and opinion elites .. whose perceptions are vital to Norfolk Southern's success". The people targeted by the campaign "tend to support companies whose leadership helps spur innovation and growth", the agency wrote, explaining in a case study how the campaign was designed to "convince people they're actually innovative"

The PR push is a window into a years-long, multimillion-dollar campaign by America's biggest railroad corporations to win favor among federal regulators and policymakers and push back against calls for tougher regulation – a successful campaign that is coming under closer scrutiny following the Ohio disaster

Another video, set to its own version of School House Rock's Conjunction Junction, starts with the lyrics: "Norfolk Southern, what's your function? Hooking up the country, helping business run. Trains! They haul everysafely and on time."Between 2015 and 2022, the Association of American Rail-



tion representing large train companies, spent more than \$39.4m lobbying the federal government, according to data compiled by the non-profit OpenSecrets. The AAR and its dues-paying members, who include Norfolk Southern, Union Pacific, BNSF and CSX, have also made millions of dollars' worth of political contributions.

But as Norfolk Southern's "Reimagine Possible" campaign reflects, the industry also employs more indirect tactics to promote what the AAR calls "balanced requlation", its euphemism for eliminating mandatory, government-enforced safety standards in favor of voluntary, industry-led oversight. An analysis by the Guardian found that between 2015 and 2019, the most recent year for which data are available, the AAR paid Subject Matter, a Washington DCbased PR and government affairs firm, more than \$23.3m for "paid media consulting + advertising", according to the AAR's annual filings with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). That sum represents nearly as much as the group spent on lobbying during the same period. Subject Matter's work for the AAR included "Freight Rail Works", which the agency described as "a comprehensive campaign to help ensure this critical industry remains top-of-mind for Washington DC-area policymakers and influencers". "Transforming for Tomorrow", another campaign produced by Subject Matter, was designed to "showcase the surprising techno-

ject Matter nor RP3 responded to a request for comment.

According to the AAR's 2019 tax filing, the trade association's "integrated communications campaign" is designed in part to demonstrate "how railroads use modern technology to improve safety and provide public benefits".

As part of its communications push, the AAR has paid for dozens of sponsored articles in the Washington Post and Politico, two publications widely read by the "policymakers and opinion elites" who the group targets with its messages of innovation and selfregulation. Under headlines such as "No need to fix a freight rail system that is thriving" and "How America's freight railroads became great again", the AAR touts its members' impact on the US economy and warns of the consequences of new regulations. Other stories, including "How freight rail is putting the brakes on human error", argue that the industry is already making technology investments on its own, with the implication (and sometimes the explicit connection) that new safety requirements are unnecessarv or even detrimental to those

# Russia rouses international anger with redfish overfishing

The population is declining rapidly but Russia has refused to observe restrictions - aided by countries offering ports or catch processing







The Irminger Sea, near Greenland and Iceland, is home to the beaked redfish a large-eyed, orange creature that typically grows up to half a metre long and lives for about 60 years. It has come to epitomise just why Russia ranks so poorly on the Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing Index – second-worst out of 152 countries in 2021.

Until recently, the beaked redfish was hunted widely in the Irminger Sea. Every three years, scientists from Iceland, Germany and Russia surveyed the state of the two stocks in the Irminger Sea, and in 2020, they concluded the redfish population was declining rapidly.

As a result, the International Council of Exploration of the Sea (ICES) – a regional fishery advisory body based in Denmark – recommended that all fishing stop. Almost all the countries and economic zones that caught redfish - the EU, UK, Iceland, Norway, the Faroe Islands and Greenland – complied. All but one

Russia categorically refused to stop catching redfish in international waters. It told the members of the countries that hunt redfish – known as the the North-East Atlantic Fisheries Commission (NEAFC) - that it rejected the evidence, didn't agree that there were two stocks and said it had conducted its own "serious scientific re-

A Norwegian representative said Russia had simply "used its legal right to object", adding that countries should "discuss conditions for an objection ... as it sometimes seems to be too easy to object just because you disagree". The Faroe Islands took a similar stance, declaring they were concerned about continued Russian redfish fisheries but opposed the EU's method of preventing them, and arguing that "conservation disputes" should be settled through dispute settlement mechanisms at regional fisheries management organisations - which the NEAFC doesn't have - or under the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. Redfish is not the only troubling Russian fishery. Others are red king crab and pollack, says Sally Yozell, a senior fellow and director of environmental security at the US thinktank the Stimson Center.

# Take the midnight train to Bikaner for a getaway from the Capital



(Agencies) ANY excuse to get out of the cluttered Capital, I was willing to take. And it came in the form of unassuming Bikaner. Like most towns in Rajasthan, this too has history, heritage and forts going for it, but unlike the other places, it doesn't have the crowd, nor the hustle- bustle. After all, it was a city created in 1459 out of a barren land by Rao Bika, a descendent of the founder of Jodhpur.

Into this desert town, I saunter in early morning after having taken the midnight train. Foggy it is and colder too but the air is light and no honking either. Soon, I'm driven to the imposing red sandstone Lallgarh Palace the seat of the Bikaner kings — spread over 88 acres. It has since become a heritage hotel. Interspersed across this palace are lawns where pretty peacocks flutter for your eyes only. To the keen- eyed and Bollywood crazy folks, Lallgarh Palace was where Ranveer Singh and Anushka Sharma planned the final wedding in Band, Baaja, Baraat . BUILT IN 1902 by the then Maharaja Rao Ganga Singh in the memory of his father Lall Singh, this palace is a hybrid of Rajput, Muslim and European architecture. Keeping an eye on all this, I wander through the corridors piecing together history and family politics. Soon enough breakfast is served and it turns out to be a tepid affair. Whether you're gathering for a holiday meal or interrupting your usual routine to meet up at a restaurant, those indulgent occasions can be sullied by feelings of shame or being out of control. But festive moments don't have to be like that. said Natalie Mokari, a dietitian based in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Many of the ways people approach eating are shaped by diet culture or societal beliefs that encourage restriction of food to get a leaner body. But research — and many people's personal experience — has shown that restrictive dieting rarely results in long-term weight "Diet culture tells us that the salad with the less you feel the need to mindlessly loss. Restrictive diets "can actually do more harm than good," dietitian and TikTok creator Steph Grasso told CNN in April 2022. Finally, kick out the dread and shame so you can just enjoy the experience, she said. That means savoring the meal, using all of your senses to appreciate what you are eating, Mokari said. Eating doesn't have to be all or nothing, she said. You can have ice cream on a Wednesday and a salad for lunch on a Saturday.

"The more that you balance it out throughout the week, the more of a balanced person you're going to be," Mokari said. Most people have favorite foods sweets or salty or fried — or alcoholic beverages that they don't want to get rid of so build those into your diet in a measured way, even if they feel indulgent, she added. And when you do build them in, don't shame yourself. Feeling guilty about your food choices causes you to make more poor choices, and so it becomes a cyclical pattern, said Brooke Alpert, a registered dietitian and author of "The Diet Detox: Why Your Diet Is Making You Fat and What to Do About It" in a 2022 inter-

# Zero-calorie sweetener linked to heart attack and stroke, study finds

(News Agency) A sugar replacement called ervthritol – used to add bulk or sweeten stevia. monkfruit and keto reduced-sugar products has been linked to blood clotting, stroke, heart attack and death, according to a new study. "The degree of risk was not modest," said lead study author Dr. Stanley Hazen, director of the Center for Cardiovascular Diagnostics and Prevention at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner Research Institute. People with existing risk factors for heart disease, such as diabetes, were twice as likely to experience a heart attack or stroke if they had the highest levels of erythritol in their blood, according to the study, published Monday in the journal Nature Medicine. "If your blood

level of erythritol was in the top 25% compared to the bottom 25%, there was about a two-fold higher risk for heart attack and stroke. It's on par with the strongest of cardiac risk factors, like diabetes," Hazen said.

Additional lab and animal research presented in the paper revealed that erythritol appeared to be causing blood platelets to clot more readily. Clots can break off and travel to the heart, triggering a heart attack, or to the brain, triggering a stroke. "This certainly sounds an alarm," said Dr. Andrew Freeman, director of cardiovascular prevention and wellness at National Jewish Health, a hospital in Denver, who was not involved in the research.


